St Stephen's School, Western Australia

St Stephen's School is a multi-campus K-12 co-educational Uniting Church school located in Perth's Northern Suburbs. It has an outstanding reputation for high educational standards and exceptional care within a Christian context. The school offers a dynamic co-curricular program that encourages students to develop their talents to the fullest.

At the Duncraig Campus, the Music Program is well-established, with one-third of students actively involved in lessons, rehearsals, and performances. The Music Department comprises five Classroom Music Specialists, 27 Instrumental Tutors, and 8 Ensemble Directors. These teams rehearse with four Concert Bands,

three Orchestras, two Jazz Big Bands, two Funk Bands, six choirs, and four Classical Guitar Ensembles.

We are fortunate to have two amazing campuses. Our younger Carramar Campus has seen significant growth in its secondary music program. Looking ahead to 2026, classroom music is thriving with increasing numbers in Years 9 to 11. Supported by three dedicated specialist teachers and an enthusiastic team of music tutors, extracurricular music continues to expand. The secondary music groups, including the Concert Band, Secondary Choir, and Vocal Ensemble, remain strong. The recent addition of five contemporary ensembles has been exciting for everyone, as they regularly perform throughout the school.

Today's concert showcases performances from Duncraig ATAR Music and Carramar General Music. Each student has chosen their preferred area of interest, ranging from Jazz, Western Art, Contemporary styles, and Music Theatre. They have dedicated themselves to bringing these amazing performances to you, and they are thrilled to have the opportunity to perform as part of the *Wesley at One* recital series.
